1. 1587 mustered from Baslow – Levies

1585 & 1587 Local Levies mustered from Baslow

12. 1796 War Assessment

People and tax due. Some occupations. Lists freeholders

13. 1797 Church Seating

Seats in the church were bought by parishioners, most by the Duke of Rutland, who then allocated them to his tenants,

This lists the seats, the parishioners and the tenants

The original churchwarden's booklet is in the Record Office

14. 1777 Shepherds Book

Hill sheep tend to need to have markings to indicate their owner. Those used by Baslow shepherds are described elsewhere on this website. The names of the farmers are included in the main summary list

15. 1797 New Parsonage

A new Parsonage was built with public subscription.

16. 1800 The Felons

The Baslow Association for the Prosecution of Felons and other Offenders was a group of Baslow residents who jointly paid the cost of prosecuting any person who had offended against a member of the Association. It was formed in 1797.

This is a list of members in 1800, and will include many prominent villagers.
