

HOW TO FIND YOUR GRAVE

Index	Alphabetical list of names, with date of death and grave number
Summary	Each grave in order, with names, date of death and (usually calculated) the year of birth, and relationship of names
Plan	Plan of churchyard showing arrangements of rows and numbers
Map	Map of churchyard, showing exact position of gravestones

It is not easy to find your gravestone on site. Especially if you are visiting from a distance, I suggest the following

- Once you have your Grave Number(s),
- Write down the numbers of the graves on either side
- Use the Plan of Graves and Numbers to note the numbers at the ends of your rows, and, if you wish, of the preceding and following rows.
- Use the Summary to add the top name in each

Example

Your grave

D12 Cocker M

End of row on left

End of row on right

Preceding row **D01 Ingram M**

D07 Gregory A

Your row **D08 Boler C** **D11 Bowler E** **D13 Marsden W** **D17 Gregory G**

Following row **D18 Gregory H** **D19 ? eroded**

Stand looking towards the river when finding "left" and "right"

Note Not all rows start or end at the edge of a block
