## **The White Family in Baslow and Bubnell**

*The main source is the parish registers of Births (Baptisms) Marriages and Deaths, Other sources include memorial Inscriptions, Hearth Tax, Tithe Awards and occasionally word from the families themselves.*

*There appears to be continuity of tenure over the years. A family in the 1500s could well have occupied that same dwelling as his descendant in the 1848 Tithe Award.*

Families in Baslow called White can be traced back to the late 1500s. There are references to White in the Court Rolls dating back to the 1300s.

There are two early lines, one in Baslow and the other in Bubnell. If they had a common ancestor it must have been in the early 1500s (or earlier) In the 1800s several new families arrived in the village. (A Calver family is not considered here but there is a separate family tree for them.)

The Hearth Tax gives an idea of the families in 1670. There were 4 separate households in Baslow, a large extended family. George White in Bubnell had 3 hearths – a big house signifying prosperity.

### **The Baslow Whites**

The Baslow family starts with John in the late 1500s, and the main line can be traced through Samuel, Sampson and Joseph to Deborah b1722. Another line leads to Henry b1797 who inherited the Bubnell house.

Samuel b1612 was prominent resident, and features on the Charity Boards in the church. His eldest son Samuel died before he did so Sampson was his successor. Joseph was wealthy. When he died in 1728 his estate including land in Totley was valued at £298. With no male heir it was inherited by Deborah, ending this White dynasty. Deborah married George Barker and later the bereaved family moved to Totley. Subsequent occupants of the White homestead are not known

In 1827 in a development in Bridge End, Baslow, a large homestead near the bridge was demolished. Two new houses were allocated to two White brothers from Yorkshire. I guess that this farmhouse was the original family home, and the brothers got the houses in compensation for its demolition in lieu of nearer relatives.

### **The Bubnell Whites**

The family starts with Richard, but there are gaps before Joseph, who married in 1711. He had only two daughters Mary (b1770) & Hellena. My suggestion is that Henry b1797 from the Baslow side of the family line took over the farm on his death. I can find no direct connection between Joseph and Henry.

The Tithe Awards places them in a dwelling at the top of Bubnell close to the present main farm there. It was demolished in 1885 and the family moved to Bubnell Hall Farm House.
