## The Wilson Family (lived elsewhere)

The Revd Joseph Wilson was headmaster of Sheffield Grammar School from 1810-1818, renowned for being carried around in a sedan chair. He committed suicide in 1818. His connection with Baslow is not apparent. He his children include three spinster daughters . Isabel 1812-1896, Mary 1814-1885, and Elizabeth 1817-1892. They share a grave in Baslow churchyard. Isabel and Elizabeth are commemorated in Baslow Church Windows. The Lychgate was built to commemorate Mary

Mary and Elizabeth were lodging in the Post Office in Bridge End in the 1881 census. They did not live in Baslow

It is evident that the Wilsons had a connection with Baslow considering their contribution to the church.

They may well be related to the Wilson family in Sheffield, who were prominent in the snuff business
