

## Rose Hill

### Rose Hill

Rose Hill is a house at Over End, Baslow, on a narrow lane adjacent to the village shop. It is present on the 1799 Rutland Estate Map. There is an old barn south of the house, now converted to a dwelling called Rosehill Grange. An archaeologist reported some years ago the its structure suggested an earlier use as stable for pack horses, in which case Rose Hill could have been an inn

### Tenants or occupiers of Rose Hill

William Frost 1727-1809, described as "Of Baslow" may have lived in Rose Hill

Matthew Frost sen 1750-1835, of Hassop, Barmaster, ? lived in Calver. May have been tenant of Rose Hill but sub let

Jebson Oddy 1792-1850 was occupant of Rose Hill in 1841 census. He was the nephew of Matthew Frost sen's wife

Matthew jun 1781-1849 of Calver, Surveyor, son of Matthew Sen was the tenant of Rose Hill Farm in 1848 Tithe Award. He died 1849, with apparently only one daughter

Joanna Frost 1785-1869, widow of Matthew Frost jun, occupied Rose Hill in 1851 & 1861 (Census)

Sarah Hodgkinson b 1819, was grand daughter of Matthew Frost by his 2<sup>nd</sup> son Samuel, occupied Rose Hill in 1871 and it remained with her eldest son John and his descendants until the mdi 1900s

*NB Sarah was married to Joseph Hodgkinson of Calver Mill, their 2<sup>nd</sup> son Edmund inherited the mill*
