Jerome (Jeremy) Hackett

Jerome Hackett was the sub accountant at Chatsworth from 1648-1668 dealing with all monies coming in and out of the house. He was a servant at Chatsworth but was responsible to the "Receiver" at Hardwick for the money. He died in 1670

An indenture dated 1672 between the 3rd Earl of Devonshire and Hugo Marsden specifies the land transferred from Jerome's widow to Hugo Marsden of Baslow. The fields are named, and are the same as those on William Senior's map of 1720 – about 90 acres of good land in the valley north of Chatsworth House adjoining the Baslow parish boundary. A good farm.

The name Hackett is listed Edensor parish records. It appears the Jerome married twice, first to Hellen who was buried in Edensor in 1637, then to (another) Hellen who survived him dying in 1683. Baslow parish records show that Jerome had a son Robert baptised in Baslow in 1634.

Jerome had five daughters by his second wife. There is no mention of any sons.
